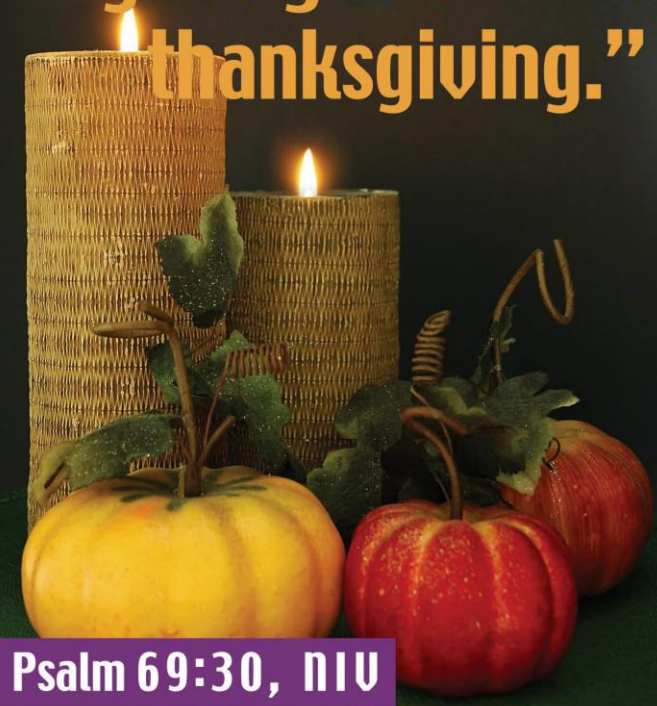

## Health Wise

**Manage stress, stay socially active, and connect to improve life quality.**

**(ref. Mass. General Hospital's "Mind, Mood and Memory," Jan. 2009)**

As a part-time volunteer "aquatic body worker" I share written information with folks whom I see in a warm pool. I'll share in the "Tuckahoe Torch" from time to time about "wellness" - enhancing the mental, physical, emotional, and spiritual quality of one's life.

Reasons for the decline of cognitive abilities in one's lifetime are varied. Some we can control, "putting the most odds in our pocket," as my grandfather would say.

A six-year study of 506 healthy individuals as reported in the January 19, 2009 issue of *the American Academy of Neurology* revealed that people who were rated as easily distressed and socially isolated were 50% more likely to develop dementia.

Implications? Lower stress, stay mentally and physically active, and participate in social activities, four areas of one's lifestyle that deserve close attention. Maintain (or make) close relationships with people who are positive, who engage in stimulating, constructive conversation. (Have we forgotten that art?)

Walk, dance, swim, or gym exercise if you can. County and city Recreation and Parks Departments list opportunities. Book and chess clubs abound. Look pas oneself - volunteer. Smile more, introduce yourself, initiate conversations, and accept invitations. And important, be patient.

Stress is a killer, changing physiological functions. We lower stress when we turn over concerns to God, praying for strength and acting on what we can help change and praying about what we can't. A daily dose of meditation keeps one close to God, Creator (still does), Redeemer (for all), Guide and Comforter (in daily living). "Your Word is a lamp to my feet and a light for my path", Psalm 119:105.

Finally, remember the human temptation to become "somebody", to garner human praise. This is impermanent. What make us "somebody" is not other people's responses to us but God's eternal love for us.

## BUILDING COMMITTEE PROGRESS REPORT

Members of our congregation pledged \$680,000 to the capital campaign initiated in May, 2008. As of August 31, 2010, our members had contributed \$511,763.12 toward the goal of \$680,000, 75.25% of the pledged amount. In addition to the pledged amount, the Session approved the application of \$125,000 from the Peggy Ross Estate to the capital campaign. This additional amount increased the anticipated funding to \$805,000. The capital campaign will conclude at the end of May, 2011. While the Building Committee would prefer that our members contribute their pledged amount by the end of May, 2011, if there are individuals who need additional months in 2011 to complete their pledge, that situation will be acceptable given the uncertain economic situation in our country.

As of August 31, 2010, the Building Committee has spent \$579,063.25 of the anticipated \$805,000 available to it. Please find below an accounting of these expenditures:

\* A member of our congregation has donated \$24,000 worth of labor and supplies for the renovation of the John Knox Chapel. That amount is not included in the total cost figure.

\*\* This project includes the cost of the removal of tile containing asbestos, roof repair, exterior painting of the sanctuary building, and creating barrier free access to the building.

\*\*\* This project includes the exterior painting and repair of the exteriors of all our church buildings other than the sanctuary building.

By the time you have your *Torch* in hand, the paving and striping of the back parking lot, the reconstruction of the dumpster area, and the renewal and leveling of the gravel on the Park Ave. and Stafford St. areas will be complete. As of the preparation of this report, the final bill is not available for this project.

The Building Committee projects that the next project will be the installation of an elevator to transport individuals from the back hallway beyond Duntreath Hall to the second floor of the new Sunday School wing.

## What's Going on with Children's Ministries

### ➤ Teachers and Snack Server/Buyers Needed

The 4th-5th grades class needs a teacher to *share* either the Christmas/Epiphany Term (Jan. 2 - Mar. 6) or the Lenten Term (Mar.13 - Apr. 17). Teachers are needed for BOTH of those terms, but we have one teacher who is able to share one of the terms. We also need snack server/buyers for Christmas/Epiphany Term (Jan. 2-Mar.6) and Easter Term (Apr. 24 - May 29). Contact Becky Loggins as soon as possible if you can help!

☑ **In the Narthex** –Available every week: a leaflet entitled *Making Room for Children in Worship*, copies of the current *Sunday School Notes*, Sunday School registration forms, and *Children's Worship Bulletins* on clipboards with crayons. Make sure your child also receives a regular bulletin and help him or her to follow along in the bulletin, the hymnal, and the Bible.

☑ **Sunday, Nov. 7- All Saints' Day**; the children's Sunday School will explore Modern Day Saints with special visitors. Don't be alarmed if you see a fire truck! This is also the last day of the All Saints term. **First Sunday Children's Church** for age 4 through 1<sup>st</sup> grade. Following "Moments with the Children" during the service, the children walk with Ms. Loggins to room 205 for a *Godly Play* story, work response, scripture reading, and prayer. Parents meet their children in room 200 following the worship service. These sessions are held on the first Sunday of every month, October through May. This is a wonderful way to begin your child's participation in worship!

☑ **Nov. 14** – Library Time with librarian Kaye Keyes for Class of the Font and Class of the Scripture, separately, in addition to regular lessons. *Godly Play* for Class of the Dove with Becky Loggins.

☑ **Nov. 21, Christ the King Sunday-** Chrismon-making in all children's Sunday School classes.

☑ **Nov. 27 through Dec. 4 – CARITAS**

☑ **Nov. 28 – First Sunday of Advent and the first day of a new Church Year.** All second floor classes move to first floor this day only except for *Godly Play* with Class of the Font in 205. Library Time for Class of the Dove with librarian Kay Keyes.

= **Through the month** - preparation for the Christmas pageant.

= **Through the month** - Vacation Bible School planning begins for VBS 2011, July 18-22.

☑ **Help Needed in Our Nurseries beginning in January**

We are in need of more adults and older youth willing to help in our nurseries during church on a scheduled basis, usually no more than 3 times in a 4-month period. **The schedule for January through May will be made during the last week of this month. NOW is the time to volunteer to be a new part of that schedule!**

☑ **Remember to read Sunday School Notes every week and check the Education Bulletin Board for information.** *Sunday School Notes* is the weekly newsletter for the children's Sunday School. It is distributed to all children attending Sunday School. Copies are also available on the table in the narthex and posted on the education bulletin board.

☑ **Use the library!** There continue to be many **new children's books** that aren't found in the public library with Bible stories and more. The library is easy to use, with self-serve instructions posted inside the door. Return your books to the table just inside the door. Make it a point to bring your family to church a little early – or stay a little late - to check out books! ### First Sunday Children's Church Full of Wonder at Camp Hanover

On Sunday morning, October 3, 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday Children's Church was experienced in the midst of the peaceful setting of Camp Hanover during our congregational retreat. Twelve children in our church family, ranging in age from two-years-old through 5<sup>th</sup> grade, explored the *Godly Play* story of Creation. The story begins asking, "What is the biggest present you have ever gotten?" and continues by saying, "There are some gifts that are so big that no one notices them. They are so huge that no one knows they are there. Sometimes the only way to know that they are there is to go back to the beginning...or maybe a little before the beginning...." The story ends by saying, "On the seventh day God rested and gave us the gift of a day to rest, to remember the gifts of all the other days, and to thank Him for those gifts." The children responded to the story with enthusiasm and amazing, unique work.

Thank you to Matthew Mahoney for having the vision to begin again the tradition of an annual retreat for our church family, and to all who helped in carrying out that vision.

This edition of TPC's biannual golf tournament was dedicated to the memory of **Chet Starkey**, our friend and avid participant in past TPC golf tournaments. Chet played in every Church golf tournament from its beginning and when he decided to no longer compete, he sponsored his own team.
