FROM THE PASTOR'S STUDY



WHAT HAPPENS WHILE WE WAIT?

In his book, *Advent and Christmas*, Henri Nouwen provides a meditation for each day of Advent. Here is his first entry:

Keep expecting loud and impressive events to convince me and others of God's saving power...Our temptation is to be distracted by them...When I have no eyes for the small signs of God's presence- the smile of a baby, the carefree play of children, the words of encouragement and gestures of love offered by friends- I will always remain tempted to despair.¹

It has been difficult to remember this in the past year when the only "loud and impressive events" tend to be the political rallies, protests, and terrorist attacks. As Christians, we may have even desired God's almighty saving power to show up in a big way and dispel all the doom and gloom. But it didn't happen, and maybe we have begun to despair.

Our ancient forbearers in the faith may have also had this experience. In the concluding words of John's prologue (1:5) we read,

"the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it."

We say these words when we light our candles on Christmas Eve. Our little lights will not fully illumine all the darkness in the world just like his light was not fully seen in his first Advent. Here again the words of Nouwen:

The small child of Bethlehem, the unknown man of Nazareth, the rejected preacher, the naked man on the cross, he asks for my full attention. The work of our salvation takes place in the midst of a world that continues to shout, scream, and overwhelm us with its claim and promises.²

We hold up our candles with defiant confidence that the light of one born into obscurity continues to grow in our world even as he does in our lives. The Light of the World is coming again and next time his light will cast out all darkness, "The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world" (John 1:9).

So, what happens while we wait? We look for the light breaking through the cracks in the darkness, we fix our sights on the rays of light that are around us and we testify to the light that will bring hope, peace, joy and love for all. The babe born to us is the best gift we couldn't live without, it is light and life for us and for others. So share this gift, cast light into the darkness that is all around by holding up the light of Christ and see what happens this year while we wait.

MY STORY

Tuckahoe has been my church family for as long as I can remember - literally - as I began attending with my parents when I was about five years old. I have so many great memories of Tuckahoe through the years, from attending Sunday School in the 'carriage house' out in the parking lot, to graduating to the sweltering room off the balcony that is now used for storage, to youth group exploits with the Brady, Buck, Wroniewicz, Flournoy, and Langdon kids. I remember the first time I nervously rang the Westminster Bells from the back of the sanctuary to start the service and the time that an unnamed youth group member caught his bulletin on fire during Youth Sunday. The Proclamations were a huge part of my faith journey, and it was during my time with that group that I can say my faith evolved from being something I 'had to do' on Sundays, to something that is at the very core of who I am.

I am so thankful to be raising my own children in this same church family and for them to be exposed to some of the same people and traditions that shaped my faith. There is nothing quite like seeing your child don a robe and acolyte for the first time, or the pride with which they march into youth group, finally being old enough to participate. I am grateful for the sense of community and service that is evident in our congregation and that we have opportunities for people from all walks and stages of life to serve and engage in outreach.

Tuckahoe has taught me that faith is about fellowship, relationships, laughter, tears, learning, growing, and giving. We are blessed to have this refuge to which we can retreat and know that we will always be welcomed, loved, and nurtured. Throughout the years, the ministers have changed; the buildings have changed; families have come and families have gone; but, the core of who Tuckahoe is has remained unchanged, and for that I am grateful. My hope for Tuckahoe is that it will continue to embody the notion that we don't change the world by going to church, but we change the world by *being* the church. My hope for my children is

that one day, years down the road, they will be able to share a story similar to mine.

avenue to a better life for the person on the other end? What if you decide to buy as many of your Christmas gifts as possible *slave free*?


I challenge you to shop *slave free* this year, to discover ways to shower those you love with gifts that make a difference from the moment they are made to the moment your loved one opens it.




END OF YEAR PLEDGES



- Sign up for a Kroger Rewards Account by entering zip code, clicking on favorite store, entering your email address and creating a password, agreeing to the terms and conditions
- You will then get a message to check your email inbox and click on the link within the body of the email.


