"Holiness and Public Piety" Patrick Dennis SERMON Part III of the Series: "Jesus and Politics"

Camper registrations at Camp Hanover this year has been higher than anticipated! As they head into the second half of the summer camp season, enrollment in many of the programs is now at, or exceeds, the capacity of the original summer staffing plan. Subsequently, there are several Camp Hanover positions available, both paid and volunteer, that need to be filled right away. Opportunities are available for those who can work 1 or more weeks any time between now and August 19. There are reside-at-camp positions as well as hourly/daily opportunities for those who can help. There are age requirements depending on the position applied for:

- Lifeguards need to be 16 years old or older
- Day Camp Counselors need to be 17 years old or older
- Sleepaway Camp Counselors need to be 18 years old or older
- Trip Drivers need to be at least 21 years old and have a clean driving record (no tickets/accidents within the last 3 years).
