Needed items: Mattresses and box springs (sets preferred), bedroom furniture, pillows for sleeping, kitchen tables and chairs, sofas, love seats, recliners, coffee and end tables, small desks, mirrors, lamps, shelves, fans & space heaters, TV's (no larger than 32" or older than 10 yrs.), radios, alarm clocks, telephones, toasters, coffee makers, mixers, blenders, dishes, glasses, silverware, pots and pans, baking pans, microwave ovens, sheets, blankets, towels, irons, vacuum cleaners, art work, garbage cans, rugs (cleaned, vacuumed, no larger than 5'x7').

<u>Items not accepted:</u> Washers, driers, refrigerators, stoves, kingsized mattresses and beds, hospital or electric beds, headboards, commercial office furniture (e.g. cubicles, large desks), cribs, car seats, strollers, or other baby equipment, toys, computers, medical

equipment, wheelchairs, kitchen cabinets, ceiling fans, light fixtures that require installation, books, clothes.

Hurricane Matthew hits Haiti: Report from the Presbytery--In the south more than 5 dead, 1 missing, 10 people injured; nearly 2,000 homes flooded; 14,500 people moved into temporary shelters; 2,703 families homeless; many fields destroyed; bridges broken; roofs flying and water carried away many animals. Many of these persons have not yet sent their children to school this year. The government usually subsidizes books to help parents, but not for this year. And now, Mathew has carried away the last bit of hope. DISASTER RELIEF NUMBER OR HAITI - DR000064.
