<u>Needed items:</u> Mattresses and box springs (sets preferred), bedroom furniture, pillows for sleeping, kitchen tables and chairs, sofas, love seats, recliners, coffee and end tables, small desks, mirrors, lamps, shelves, fans & space heaters, TV's (no larger than 32" or older than 10 yrs.), radios, alarm clocks, telephones, toasters, coffee makers, mixers, blenders, dishes, glasses, silverware, pots and pans, baking pans, microwave ovens, sheets, blankets, towels, irons, vacuum cleaners, art work, garbage cans, rugs (cleaned, vacuumed, no larger than 5'x7').

**Items not accepted:** Washers, driers, refrigerators, stoves, kingsized mattresses and beds, hospital or electric beds, headboards, commercial office furniture (e.g. cubicles, large desks), cribs, car seats, strollers, or other baby equipment, toys, computers, medical equipment, wheelchairs, kitchen cabinets, ceiling fans, light fixtures that require installation, books, clothes.
