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## HAVE YOU EVER READ THE ENTIRE BIBLE?

This is a question that many of us have been asked. If we are honest, most of us have answered “No.” People I know who have started out with the best intentions quit once they get to the book of *Numbers* with the genealogies that go on for chapter after chapter. A “cover-to-cover” reading is the most difficult to sustain. And so our biblical exposure as Presbyterians is, by and large, limited to Sunday morning lessons and segmented Bible studies.

And yet, a more comprehensive reading of the Bible allows us to see the arc of God’s story from Creation to Consummation and to grow in our awareness and appreciation of God’s involvement in the created order. Our Christian Formation Committee believes that we should encourage our members to know God’s story because it is our story. God’s work over generations continues to shape us as we seek to love and serve God and God’s people.

For this reason, beginning this fall during Sunday School, all children, youth and adult classes will be engaging in *The Story* ([www.thestory.com](http://www.thestory.com)). This is not a typical “read the Bible in a year” challenge. “*The Story* is an abridged, chronological Bible that reads like a novel. There are no verse references, and Scripture segments are seamlessly woven together with transition text into a single grand narrative. For those intimidated or overwhelmed by the unabridged Bible, *The Story* helps people understand God’s Word more fully and engage with it more easily.” (from the website). With questions to guide the discussion, each class session will challenge us to consider where God’s story can be found in our story.

My hope is that our entire church will unify in this common journey through Scripture so that we may come to see more clearly how God is acting in the story of Tuckahoe. Maybe inspiration for new initiatives will emerge. Perhaps more people will sense a call to engage Scripture more deeply in their personal lives, and find ways of living out God’s story more faithfully so as to witness more confidently in the wondrous Good News that God has entrusted to us to share.

You are invited to join in this endeavor. Over the next few months, we will provide more details about this exciting curriculum.

In the meantime, I pray you will consider joining in this journey and explore your story and our story in God’s story.

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## CHILDREN SHOW US THE KINGDOM

<sup>15</sup> People were bringing even infants to him that he might touch them; and when the disciples saw it, they sternly ordered them not to do it. <sup>16</sup> But Jesus called for them and said, "Let the little children come to me, and do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs. <sup>17</sup> Truly I tell you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God as a little child will never enter it."

Luke 18: 15-17

Jesus' words to his disciples are radical. In the Roman context of his day, infants and children were subject to adverse conditions and possessed little intrinsic value. They occupied the lowest rung on the ladder of status. The disciples had a hard time understanding that Jesus was breaking social norms and that he was more concerned about honesty, innocence and humility than social customs.

This is a far-cry from our culture. We value our children, celebrate who they are and their gifts. In that vein, you may have noticed that our children are leading in worship more frequently through music offerings. You may have also noticed that what they sing coincides with the theme of that particular Sunday. Our belief is that children are full participants in the worship of God.

**Accordingly, on June 5 our children will be leading us in worship in the liturgy, proclaimed Word, and music.**

I encourage you to support our children, but perhaps in a little different way than the culture around us. To the Romans, children were seen as insignificant and dismissed. In our culture, and even the church, we tend to overly praise them through applause and in doing so place the focus on how they *perform* rather than Who they *proclaim*. Our applause sends a message that their offering is set apart from the rest of worship as a kind of entertainment. That is the wrong message. Children learn that worship is about offering their lives to God when we as adults help them understand that what they do is the same as what we do. They help us see the kingdom more clearly when we acknowledge them as full

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participants in God's kingdom, and not as guest performers. By welcoming the opportunity to be led in worship and have the Word proclaimed by the youngest members of the kingdom of God and the Church, we enhance our own worship experience while also welcoming children in a Christ-like way. So, we hope you are inspired when our children lead us in worship on June 5.

Vacation Bible School 2016 April Update with Wonderful Ways to Serve!


Maybe YOU would like to take on just "a piece" of a hallway or one room as your gift to VBS...

## THE EASY "WHAT AND HOW" OF VOLUNTEERING FOR VBS

This year, we will continue to have our no-classrooms VBS. There will be VBS group shepherds instead of teachers (this year called "Lifeguards"). Everyone will gather in and dismiss from Duntreath Hall ("Surf Shack") instead of classrooms. The "lifeguards", along with an assistant and youth helper, lead their group to each activity and help them as needed. Because there are no classrooms, we are in need of one youth helper for each age group and a few more youth helpers for each of the activities.

To make leading an activity less time-consuming, an option for the tasks of the roles of Cooking leader and Crafts leader have an option to be divided in this way: there will be volunteers who will plan and prepare the Cooking and Crafts activities. There will be separate leaders who will carry out the plan by setting up the activity with the help of assistants and youth helpers. They will then briefly review the Bible story of the day with each group of children, explain the activity, help the children as needed, and clean up with the help of assistants and youth helpers. Those leaders can sign up to help for one day, or more than one day. Of course, if one person wants to be the primary leader for all of the above, that will work, too! Be sure not to let the word "leader" discourage you! Becky will be happy to give you more than enough information and direction to make any role easy and rewarding!


## NEW OPPORTUNITIES FOR THOSE WITH LIMITED TIME TO GIVE:

This year, we hope to have hourly assistants who will be present to help Becky Goode, the director, in various ways. The hour one assistant will arrive before VBS begins and will be able to answer volunteers' questions and do other prep tasks while Becky greets parents and children. The final hour assistant will do much of the same while Becky checks in with parents as they arrive for dismissal. The assistants during the time in between will circulate and help Becky take care of necessary organizational tasks, as well as help other volunteers, as needed. These essential people will be back-up help for Becky at times when, as often happens, needs of or questions from more than one area come up at the same time. Becky will meet with these people before VBS week so that they will have the information they need to help in this way.


Tell your family, friends and neighbors. Take registration forms to them! We would love to reach our maximum of 75 children in attendance!

## FIFTY DAYS OF JOY

When the joyous day of the celebration of the Resurrection is over, it serves us well to remember that the time of Easter goes on. Easter is such a huge mystery and celebration that we can't keep it in just one day. Easter is a festival season of fifty days whose first day is Easter Day, the Sunday of the Resurrection, and whose last day is the Day of Pentecost. The time to get ready to enter the mystery of Easter, Lent, is greater than the time to get ready to enter the mystery of Christmas, Advent. Easter is an even greater mystery and celebration than Christmas. The fortieth day of Easter is Ascension Day, this year on May 14, always on a Thursday and, consequently, easily forgotten. (Read about the event of Christ's Ascension: Acts 1:6-11.)

The word Easter comes from Eostre, a Teutonic goddess whose name is associated with springtime, growth, and fertility. In most languages the name of the day is Pascha, which means "Passover". The color of this time of the church year is, as is Easter Day, white for purity, joy, and celebration. We remember this time especially with the empty cross, a sign of the victory of the Resurrection. Remember that each and every Sunday throughout the year is a "little Easter", reminding us as Christians of the Resurrection, since it was on the first day of the week that Jesus rose from the dead. During the fifty days, Eastertide, help your family continue the great celebration by lighting a candle at your evening meals and saying a prayer of thankful joy! It is also appropriate to have mini egg hunts throughout this time. Make the most of those plastic eggs! Remember that the eggs, chicks, bunnies and butterflies are symbols of new life and reminders of the Resurrection of Christ and new life in each of us. Alleluia! Christ is risen! Happy Easter!

- ◆ Sponsor a participant: The cost per participant is \$325. This cost is borne by the participant and the Mission Trip Fund. However, no one will be denied the opportunity to go if they can't pay. Contributions to the Mission Trip Fund will help subsidize the trips for anyone needing assistance and also will help maintain the fund.
- ◆ Pray, pray, pray: Remember in your prayers the participants, the leaders, and Appalachia Service Project and its work throughout those states in Appalachia.

## PRAYER EMPHASES FOR APRIL

The Outreach Committee makes donations to agencies in our community through our budget line item of Community Ministries. This month you are asked to remember three of these agencies in your prayers.

**Crossover Health Clinic** is Virginia's largest free health clinic. Most of the 6800 patients treated in a year are the working poor who do not qualify for Medicaid. This agency receives no direct federal funding and does not accept public or private health insurance. Crossover Clinic depends on volunteers and donations to sustain its efforts of serving the uninsured, thus promoting a healthier community. Pray for the work of this clinic.

**FeedMore** is Central Virginia's core hunger-relief organization which includes the Central Virginia Food Bank, Meals on Wheels, and the Community Kitchen programs. Under this umbrella the hunger needs of many in our community are met - from children who need food during the summer when not in school to shut ins who receive food through Meals on Wheels. Pray for these programs and for members of Tuckahoe who serve as volunteers for FeedMore.

**Hearth of Henrico** (formerly Interfaith Services of Henrico) is a faith-based organization that provides emergency relief to Henrico families when all other sources of assistance have been exhausted. Tuckahoe has been involved by providing Thanksgiving baskets and the backpack program which provides emergency supplies to children in a crisis situation.




