
May God bless Becky on her way. And since prayer is a vital part of Becky's life of faith, I invite you to join me in praying the following prayer for her...



AS MY "FAREWELL", LET ME TELL YOU A STORY...

Let me tell you about a miracle. Let me tell you about loss, about love, about lost & found. Then let me tell you about a church family who loves and sustains beyond measure.

A former first grade teacher and newly divorced mom of two young children, consumed by a horrific custody battle, was asked to be on a church ad-hoc committee to figure out how to revive the children and youth Sunday School. How could she? She was weary. Constant court battles, and being the best mom she could be left her with seemingly nothing to give. The pastor didn't accept that answer, but said, "If you want to do something badly enough, you will find a way."

She took those words to heart, then and forevermore. She found a way, and in the process, without intending to, began to have a clear vision of what that Sunday School could be, how it would look, what should be done. She was called in a very strong way by God, to apply for the newly created position of Director of Children and Youth Ministries. The passion for serving in that way was strong, true and undoubtedly God-given. She asked God every day to show her how to help Him in her work, work that was not a job, but a way of life.

She journeyed on God's path to a church family who welcomed her, who supported her, who lifted her up in the most weary, challenging, and broken-hearted times. That church family is you.

Her personal life did not include that same prayer, but a determined "God I know this is right, help me make it happen" frame of mind, asking God to endorse her plans every step of the way, resulting in mistake upon mistake. She'd survived the loss of a brother and then her dad, and later her mom, too, and faced enormous challenges of family issues.

Strength was not a question, that super-strength her grandmother said that God gives you when you need it. And there was, as a constant, that exceptionally loving church family, who became her family.

Then, after 12 1/2 years of being wrapped in the arms of that loving church family, of passionately serving God among them, a love lost so long ago - over 40 years ago - was found. It was found not by humans, but by the grace of God, nothing short of a miracle. It was the rare kind of deep, true, never-ending, connected love that songs are written about, that Hallmark cards try to describe but fall short. There was no question, no doubt about what would be next. God was huge and paved the way before the next step was even reached.



YEAR THREE OF OUR NEW VBS FORMAT! YOU WILL LOVE JOINING IN!

Have you ever thought of our Vacation Bible School as an outreach project? Over half of the children who attend are from the Richmond area and either attend another church or do not currently have a church home. Due to your time, efforts and monetary support, the impact of this event is more than meets the eye. The new Vacation Bible School schedule that we tried in 2014 was so well-received that it will continue! It extends the time in each activity, and eliminates classrooms and classroom time. We gather and dismiss from Duntreath Hall. *What does this mean for volunteers?* You have the opportunity to be "shepherds" instead of teachers, leading your group to, and helping them as needed in, each activity. You may instead want to be an assistant to a shepherd, which is a good way to serve if you haven't helped recently or at all. There are other ways to help, too, including decorating a small space with easy ideas provided, donating or loaning items, assisting in an activity, and leading music! Here's what you can do: sign up as a shepherd, assistant, youth helper, or other listed volunteer at the display in Duntreath Hall or by contacting Becky Goode, AND attend the meeting on June 12 in room 106, following worship! If you cannot attend the meeting, Becky or one of the other leaders will meet with you at your convenience. 





Bright Beginnings

Even though most of our children are just getting out of school for the summer, it's time to start planning for Tuckahoe's participation in the YMCA's Bright Beginnings Program.

For those of you not familiar with the YMCA's Bright Beginnings Program, it is a 23 year old effort to provide children from low-income families with new clothes, shoes, etc. to help ensure that they start the school year off on the right foot. We need volunteers to shop with these children to help them pick out their new fall clothes. (The \$100 shopping limit is provided through community support). The time commitment is about two and a half hours. This time also includes the opportunity to share a meal with your assigned child. As in the past, shoppers need to be 16 years old or older (13 through 15 year olds may shop with another adult and child). Children under 13 are asked not to attend so that the shopper can give his/her undivided attention to their assigned child in the program. If you are not able to shop with a child, another way to help is to make a monetary contribution to Tuckahoe Presbyterian earmarked for YMCA Bright Beginnings. Volunteer dates are yet to be determined so stay tuned to our web site and the weekly emails for further information.

Vacation Bible School will be held from **9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.** the week of **July 18-22**. VBS is open to all children ages three years (born by 1/1/13) through rising fifth graders. Please note that all participants must be toilet trained. Nursery will be available only for younger children of VBS volunteers. This summer's program is "**SURF SHACK - CATCH THE WAVE OF GOD'S AMAZING LOVE!**" At **SURF SHACK**, children will become "surfers" as they experience God's amazing love by exploring God's mission for their lives, encounter powerful water stories from the Bible, and discover ways to live out that amazing love. 
