FROM THE PASTOR'S STUDY

DISCIPLESHIP

Discipleship is a process that does not find completion during this earthly life.¹

This idea was in an article the Session read on "Christian Nurture." It was a reminder to me how often we can become comfortable in our Christian identity and as a result stagnate in our growth. Like any form of "discipline" from which the word "discipleship" is derived, we need to be stretched, to add elements to our routines that challenge us, whether this is physical exercise or academic or professional vocations. We know we need to constantly be growing in those areas, so, why is it often we believe we can "take it easy" in our Christian vocation?

One reason may be that we believe we have learned all we need to be faithful followers of Jesus. We have the basics—we pray, we attend worship, we reach out in God's love to those in need. That seems to be enough to be a "good" Christian.

And yet, as society around us changes we need to adapt. We live in an increasingly globalized culture where ethical questions confront us daily. How should we "be in the world, but not of the world?" How should we act in ways that don't conform to the culture and yet still be inviting others to know the God we serve? How do we do this as our city and county are accelerating in racial and religious diversity? And how do we address the undercurrents of violence, hate, and discrimination without casually disregarding or demonizing the people whose beliefs and acts we consider despicable?

None of these issues have cultural solutions. The only way to work through them is in Jesus Christ. We must study him and his ministry through Scripture, alone and together. We also gain understanding by studying the faith of saints of old, such as the Reformation era, who struggled to address issues of their time in faith-centered ways and by studying modern Christian prophets, such as Adam Hamilton and Jamie Ivey, who have a word that challenges the church and inspires us to be bold witnesses.

You don't have to search far for opportunities to grow, to wrestle in authentic ways with the most pressing issues of our time—such opportunities are right here! Our church, through our Christian Formation Ministry offers a wide range of classes on Sunday mornings as well as alternative opportunities during the week to prayerfully discern where you need to grow the most.

So, I encourage...no, I implore you, to find a class that speaks to you. Read over the descriptions, invest yourself in a class. Engage yourself fully and be willing to be shaped by the sharing. I believe that if more of us participate in Sunday School, Wednesday Nights, Mission opportunities, Seminars, and Fellowship events this year we will see changes that will translate to new ways of being Christ in this world and will enable us to more wonderfully live into our mission

Called by God to be the Heart, Voice, Hands and Feet of Christ where the Spirit leads us. It takes you and me, it takes all of us. So join in the journey.



Each week we will dive into a topic from the news that will


challenge us on how our faith informs our daily lives. Our lessons will include:





"Covenants with God" where we will "consider the major covenants God made with people on behalf of the earth and the human community".

Moses: In the Footsteps of the Reluctant Prophet



All proceeds will be used for Mission efforts coordinated through the Outreach Committee. Funds raised will be channeled to Mission Trips, *Rise Against Hunger*, and other mission-related efforts.

RISE AGAINST HUNGER EVENT (FORMERLY, STOP HUNGER NOW) OCTOBER 28, 2017

Our 5th annual packaging event is fast approaching. Mark your calendars for Saturday, October 28th. This great morning, appropriate for all ages 4 and up, will find you decked out in the finest of hairnets, standing elbow to elbow with your friends to measure, pour, weigh and assemble meals to be shipped to those in need in the poorest areas of our world.

In 1998, envisioning a world without hunger, Ray Buchanan — a United Methodist minister — founded *Stop Hunger Now*. In 2017, Stop Hunger Now rebranded to become *Rise Against Hunger*. After enlisting as a U.S. Marine during the Vietnam War, Ray Buchanan quickly recognized that accomplishing a mission required "commitment to something larger than yourself."

Driving *Rise Against Hunger's* work is the recognition that ending hunger is more than just feeding people, which led *Rise Against Hunger* to focus its feeding programs in areas where we can have a real impact and expand its hunger-fighting programs beyond meal packaging and distribution.

On Saturday, October 28th Tuckahoe will be hosting our 5th annual Rise Against Hunger packaging event in Duntreath Hall.

As you can tell, we will need many volunteers to package meals for shipment to places around the globe. Church members, family and friends, ages 4 and up, are welcome to participate in this fun-filled activity. If you are not able to participate in our packaging event you can still contribute to our efforts with a monetary donation. All donations go towards paying for the raw materials needed to go into the meals. Please consider volunteering to help support this worthwhile organization by either participating on October 28th or through a monetary donation.

The chosen book for this month is


The Paris Wife by Paula McLain.

TPC MUSIC MINISTRIES-NEW SPACE!

There are great things on the horizon for our Music Ministry at Tuckahoe! During the summer we saw the addition of a brand new piano for the sanctuary, which sounds and looks beautiful. As we begin our fall programs, we will have the use of a larger refurbished Music Room (with 6 windows!) on the second floor of the Education

Building — Room 210. This new choir space will afford convenience for our children to come to the Music Room for their music time during Sunday School without having to travel to the Sanctuary as in the past; give added space for growth in our Chanel Choir; and better space for our music library and storage. The current choir room, behind the Chancel, will be transformed into a Handbell Room and robing space; with the handbell tables remaining constantly up and in place for rehearsal.


