In spite of its function as a brutal form of execution, the cross stands at the center of our faith as a symbol of life. There can be no Easter without Good Friday, no Resurrection without the Crucifixion. Indeed, the cross, rather than the empty tomb, has held the place of honor as the primary symbol of the Christian faith. A modern expression of this idea may be found in the custom of flowering the cross. As we did last year, Tuckahoe will celebrate the flowering of the cross on Easter morning. You are invited to bring fresh blooms from your gardens to help fill the cross with emblems of "new life".

Immediately following worship next Sunday there will be an Easter Egg Hunt on the church lawn for toddlers through 4 years old and 5 years old through 5th grade. We will gather in front of Wilson Hall where groups will be separated and given instructions by Sarah Dennis.
