MADE TO SERVE

"They brought the donkey to Jesus and threw their clothes on it, and he sat on it. Many people spread their clothes on the road, and others spread leafy branches cut from fields." (Mark 11:7-8)

This is part of the text we hear read on Palm Sunday. This day we remember the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem, with songs of Hosanna and children waving palm branches and our thoughts turn to the road Jesus will walk during Holy Week. This year, we will be doing all these things, however we will be starting off a little differently.

On Sunday, March 25 our worship service will begin at 9:30 a.m. and then at 10:15 we will begin our "Service Beyond the Walls". We will spend the rest of the morning preparing the campus to host those who will come from near and far to hear the Good News of Jesus Christ we proclaim on Easter. This will be our all-church Spring Clean-Up day. There will be ways to serve for people of all ages and abilities.

Tuckahoe participates in many different ministries, but many of those ministries could not be possible without our physical building. And as we know, many hands make quick work. Our hope is that the church body with its many members will come together on this Sunday morning to serve together. In Mark 10 Jesus reminds us "for even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve..." We are a people made to serve, made to glorify God with the work of our hands.

This promises to be a wonderful day of connection with each other, connection with our neighbors and connection with those we don't even know, through an outreach component. It may be a different kind of Sabbath then we normally observe, but "The Sabbath was made for man and not man for the Sabbath. So then, the Son of Man is Lord even of the Sabbath." We will lay out our clothes and palm branches in our own Tuckahoe way to prepare the church for the joy of the Resurrection, to prepare our hearts to receive Christ's gift, and to serve as Jesus reminds us we are made to do. See you there!




P.S. This is a Sunday where your "Sunday best" can stay home and your "best work clothes" get to make an appearance!. Come dressed and ready to work and serve!

FLOWERING THE CROSS

One of the great Easter traditions is the flowering of the cross. People bring and place colorful fresh flowers on a drab wooden cross. What's behind this? Is it just a pretty decoration? Well, it does look beautiful but there are also some beautiful traditions and meanings associated with

the flowering of the cross. A sixth century hymn celebrates this beauty with these words:

"Faithful cross! Above all other, one and only noble tree! None in foliage, none in blossom, none in fruit they peer may be."

The tree of life in the Garden of Eden has often been seen as a prefiguring of the cross. Some legends even say that the wood of Christ's cross came from the tree of life or from a tree that grew from seeds of the tree of life.

There is another legend that says at Christ's death the cross burst into

blooming flowers. Art work from the sixth century shows a flowering cross. The point in all this is that the cross of Christ is the new tree of life and every cross now flowers with new life. Death has been defeated and Christ is risen. Alleluia!

MONTREAT WOMEN'S CONNECTION

We are so excited to offer women of the church th chance to attend the Montreat Women's Connection Conference August 10-12 in Montreat, North Carolina. There will be a chance for worship, workshops, fellowship, hiking, sleeping, and lots of fun! Those of us who had the opportunity to go last year had a wonderful weekend and can't wait to go back!

This year the keynote speaker is Kate Bowler. At thirty-five, after writing her first book about the American Prosperity Gospel, Bowler was a professor at the School of Divinity at Duke and a new mother, when she received the earth-shattering diagnosis of Stage IV colon cancer. Reckoning with the news, Bowler discovered, to her chagrin, that she would have to learn how to give up her own "prosperity gospel." As she learns to live with cancer as a chronic condition, Bowler speaks powerfully about the ways in which her brush with mortality has transformed her. She also frankly addresses the uniquely American concept that tragedy is a test of character and looks at the different ways that people try to rationalize suffering and catastrophe, for better or worse. Each registration will receive a copy of her book, Everything Happens for a Reason and Other Lies I've Loved.

The story goes that in 1917 Mata Hari, the famous exotic dancer who turned spy in WWI, refused to wear a blindfold when she was executed by a French firing squad. "Looking mortality straight in the eye is no easy feat." (C. Doughty, Smoke Gets in Your Eyes ... & Other Lessons, 2014.) Our tendency is to push death to the margins of our lives – let's not think/talk about that, for goodness sakes! But the truth is that we are all going to die. This is a reality too few families seem able or willing to discuss. Sometimes parents desire such a conversation while adult children resist. On the other hand some of us will leave behind loved ones who may struggle with the details of our affairs and our desires. Conversations about

how our life and legacy are remembered and celebrated are of singular importance. Where better to face our mortality than in the church, where we affirm that death is not the end – that death is swallowed up in victory – victory in the One whose death and resurrection brings us the promise of eternal life?


