Once ordained, she will retain the responsibilities of her current position as the Director of Christian Formation under her new title as Covenant Pastor. She will then be permitted to administer the sacraments of the Lord's Supper and Baptism and will do pastoral visits and preach more frequently (see article on page 3 for more details.) I encourage you to congratulate Sarah on fulfilling her journey.

Linda Kurtz is our Seminary Intern through April (see article on page 1). She brings with her great experience and a willingness to engage in all areas of the church's ministry. Expect to see her in worship weekly, at Sunday School, Youth Group, and on Wednesday Nights. Please welcome her and take time to get to know her.

SARAH DENNIS, A CALL TO MINISTRY

If you have heard Sarah Dennis's life story you know she first experienced a call to ministry when she was a junior in college. Working at a Christian summer camp, she felt a definite call on her life to partner with God in ministry. After finishing college, she worked at her home church in Katy, Texas in the youth program. Through her two years there, she discerned that local church ministry was where she was being called and Seminary was the correct next path for her.

She entered Princeton Seminary in 2004 and graduated in 2007. She was on a journey to ordination which she delayed because her marriage and raising a family took temporary precedence. This resulted in a delay in the completion of the final requirements for ordination in the PC/USA. In 2011 she began the ordination process in PC/USA as an inquirer, a term meaning someone who is a member of a congregation and who enters into a covenant relationship with a Presbytery to become a Teaching Elder. In 2014 she passed the ordination exams and in May of this year, after much perseverance, she satisfied almost all of those prerequisites and became "certified ready to receive a call".

The Presbytery of the James' Committee on Ministry has approved Sarah's path to ordination, assuming success on Saturday, October 20 where she will answer questions posed by the Committee and the assembled commissioners and where she will preach a sermon. Thus, she may be ordained to a yearly renewable position at Tuckahoe into a non-installed position, accountable to Session. This position is NOT in an installed role such as a Pastor, Associate Pastor or Co-Pastor. According to the Book of Order these positions would require a Pastor Nominating Committee in place and an open search conducted. In the PC/USA ordination is authorized by the Presbytery under conditions set only by the Presbytery. Sarah's ordination has been authorized by the Presbytery of the James and, in this case, according to the Book of Order it has been permitted as "a temporary pastoral relationship" renewable on a yearly basis. The title for this position may vary from Presbytery to Presbytery. It is referred to in POJ policies as "Covenant Pastor" and it is a position under the direct supervision of the Session.

What, if anything, will be different? Several upcoming changes in staff will require Session to develop a new staffing model for our church and, in so doing, Sarah's current responsibilities will be changed somewhat. Rest assured, however, a majority of Sarah's current duties and responsibilities to Christian Formation will remain the same. Most importantly for our congregation, once ordained, Sarah will be able to preside at the communion table and perform baptisms as a Minister of Word and Sacrament. This is the goal of all who feel called to and prepare for ordination. In addition, Sarah will also be available to preach, lead funeral/memorial services and weddings as needed.

Everyone is invited to attend the **October 20** Presbytery meeting (as visitors) in support of Sarah's candidacy. Sarah will preach at 1:30 pm at Lord Jesus Korean Church in Midlothian (we will send out a notice of that) followed by the final part of her examination. Let us give thanks and pray for Sarah as she prepares for that day.



and minds together in prayer Tuesday mornings at 9:30 am in the Church Parlor.





THE HEALING PLACE CARITAS AND ADDICTION ISSUES

We are all familiar with CARITAS and its programs for the homeless. For many years Tuckahoe has housed homeless groups- in earlier years groups of men and more recently homeless families. What you may not know is that CARITAS sponsors programs other than that of providing shelter.

One such program is <u>The Healing Place</u> which serves men with addiction issues. <u>The Healing Place</u> model was identified in 2000 to help fill a gap in the homeless services network since addiction recovery resources were not available to people with little or no income. <u>The Healing Place</u> model was chosen based on sobriety outcome, long term connectivity, peer -to-peer recovery mentoring, cost effectiveness, and the ability to return participants to society where they become tax-paying citizens.

Recently three members of the Outreach Committee toured <u>The Healing Place</u>. We were most impressed with the program and its very strict requirements for the participants as they move through the program's progression. We were especially impressed with the mentoring of the participants by those who successfully completed the process. The rate of sobriety at the end of one year is impressive. <u>The Healing Place</u> serves only men, so what about women in need of such services? Currently such facilities for women in our area, who have limited or no income, are virtually non-existent. So how does CARITAS address the needs of these women? Currently some are sent out of state for treatment but since this is a costly solution,

very few women are able to get help. In order to address this problem, CARITAS is in the process of developing a similar program for women.

On October 21 you will have the opportunity to learn more about this latest project when Tiffany Terry from CARITAS will be presenting a Moment for Mission at our worship service. Plan to be present to learn more about this



newest program which addresses the widespread problem of addiction.

CARITAS FAMILY FOCUS
IS COMING
Did you know that Tuckahoe serves as a shelter to homeless families for one week every year, providing food, shelter, and fellowship to community members in crisis? Tuckahoe is part of the vast community network that is part of CARITAS, a local non-profit whose mission and purpose revolve around helping our most vulnerable neighbors break the cycles of homelessness and addiction.

Tuckahoe will be hosting the CARITAS Family Focus program from Saturday,

What does this mean? It means that for a week, we will be providing food, shelter, and fellowship to homeless families in our community. The upstairs Sunday School classrooms will become makeshift bedrooms and living quarters for families, as we provide shelter for up to 30 individuals, which includes infants, school age children, teens, and parents.

There are a number of ways that you can support this effort: assisting with set up, making bagged lunches, purchasing breakfast items, preparing and serving dinner, or assisting with doing laundry. 
