\*Affirmation of Faith Adapted from the Confession of 1967, 9.08 In Jesus of Nazareth, true humanity was realized once for all. Jesus, a Palestinian Jew, lived among his own people and shared their needs, temptations, joys, and sorrows. There will be no children's bells or chime choir so that everyone can attend the Ash Wednesday service.
