February is National Heart Month, and the Fellowship Committee will be hosting an informal **CPR/AED Session TODAY, immediately following worship in Duntreath.** This program will be conducted by the Tuckahoe Volunteer Rescue Squad and will be interactive with them, providing "dummies" for participants to practice CPR on, as well as learning how to operate an AED (Automated External Defibrillator). We encourage you to attend to help become a part of the "Nation of Lifesavers" that can make a difference between life and death when someone experiences a cardiac event.

Ash Wednesday begins our season of Lent, a time when we journey with Jesus towards his death and resurrection. This year, **Ash Wednesday is on February 18.** We will have a thirty-minute service offered at **5:30pm** in the Sanctuary, which includes Scripture, music, a brief meditation, and the imposition of ashes. *Childcare is available for children 0-4 years old beginning at 5:00pm. This service will be live-streamed.* For those who cannot join in the evening, you are invited to stop by the church office (off Stafford Place) **between 12:00pm and 1:00pm to receive "ashes-on-the-go"**- a brief blessing and imposition of ashes. We look forward to seeing you as we begin the journey of Lent together.

"The Agreement in Jerusalem" – A Lenten Adult Sunday School class, beginning Sunday, February 22, at 9:15am, Room 106. The season of Lent leads up to Good Friday and Easter, when we remember the crucifixion and celebrate the resurrection of Jesus. This six-week class will investigate the events and politics leading up to the agreement of Roman and Jewish authorities to execute the young preacher and teacher from Galilee. This class will be taught by Christopher "Chris" Gatewood. Chris is the founder of Threshold Counsel, advising startups and established businesses on intellectual property, technology law, and growth-stage legal needs. He is deeply engaged in the Richmond community, serving on nonprofit boards and contributing his expertise through teaching, writing, and public service.
